

So, despite his spinal cord Injury, he made a conscious decision to persevere, build new dreams -- and triumph in the face of life's adversities.

Today, Anthony is an entrepreneur who is building a career in business, motivational speaking and broadcasting. In his new role, Anthony takes audiences on a journey, delivering his life's message with raw passion and startling reality.

Anthony is also pursuing his lifelong Olympic dream. As a 2016 Rio de Janeiro Paralympics hopeful in the sport of handcycling, Anthony continues to push forward.



COURTENAY FRAZER, "PERFECT CADENCE" FEATURE BAND



Courtenay Frazer is a pianist with a wealth of stylistic knowledge. He has been singing and playing instruments in the church since 1986, winning district and regional Teen Talent competitions for group ensembles, as well as piano solos at the church he attended - Driftwood Church of God. Courtenay went on to play keyboards for a country folk band, *The Haltons*, directed by his late father, Wosley Frazer. His journey soon took him into other arenas of music, where he began singing for the Gospel quartet "*Surrender*", a well-known group on the Toronto Gospel music scene.

Courtenay's diverse musical inspiration can be attributed to his deep appreciation for the music of such Gospel greats as Thomas Whitfield, Daryl Coley, The Clark Sisters and Ben Tankard, as well as his affinity for the artistry of the top Jazz players known as Oscar Peterson, Herbie Hancock, Art Tatum, and Chick Chorea.

His love for music encouraged him to study at Humber College of the Performing Arts where he completed studies in the Art of Jazz in 1999. In the same year Courtenay formed *Perfect Cadence*, a Gospel Jazz Group which encompasses the traditional make up of Bass, Drums, and Keys.

Since then, Courtenay has moved into challenging yet inspiring territories of music that have allowed him to bring new light to Gospel Jazz, embracing the feel of Smooth Jazz, Fusion and other realms of music.



The Youth Development Program at OMVIC

I was introduced to the Youth Development Program by our Executive Director, Carl Compton, who had met Lance Wilson, one of the Directors of the Youth Development Program, at a neighbourhood event. Carl was immediately impressed and shared his interest in the program with me, interested in having OMVIC play a role within the program.

The Youth Development Program is a youth leadership program based in Scarborough that has provided its participants for the past 19 years with a unique, transformative experience that has inspired them to move beyond their perceived limits. And it has been my experience that it is - in fact - a huge success.

To date we have had two successful placements at OMVIC. The first was Jasmyn St. Hilaire back in August 2014. Jasmyn, a high school senior, impressed me from the start. When she came in for her interview she appeared mature beyond her young age as she is a very confident young woman. The interview process was the same as that of any candidate seeking permanent employment with OMVIC and Jasmyn didn't disappoint. Jasmyn was an easy fit with the team as she was very personable, and eager to learn.

We are currently working with our second placement, Emmanuel Dover. Emmanuel is a recent high school graduate and once again the level of maturity and professionalism is notable. Emmanuel has demonstrated himself as hard working and conscientious about his work. He has fit in well with the team and the team enjoys working with him.

As an HR Manager I have interviewed my fair share of candidates and both youth placements have exceeded expectations. The Youth Development Program has proven to be a valuable and worthwhile initiative for the young people in the Malvern neighbourhood and OMVIC is looking forward to continuing to be a contributing partner. I have seen first-hand that the program is having a positive effect on how these individuals conduct themselves and I am confident that it will serve them well in the future.

SANDRA WHITING HOSTESS



Dance Educator and Choreographer


