



In February 2015, Laura returned to London to represent Osgoode in an international mediation competition where she received a first place award in an individual category. Upon completing her degree, Laura was a recipient of the Dean's Gold Key.

FEATURE BAND

Courtenay Frazer is a pianist with a wealth of stylistic knowledge.

He has been singing and playing instruments in the church since 1986, winning district and regional Teen Talent competitions for group ensembles, as well as piano solos at the church he attended - Driftwood Church of God. Courtenay went on to play keyboards for a country folk band, The Haltons, directed by his late father, Wosley Frazer. His journey soon took him into other arenas of music, where he began singing for the Gospel quartet "Surrender", a well-known group on the Toronto Gospel music scene.

Courtenay's diverse musical inspiration can be attributed to his deep appreciation for the music of such Gospel greats as Thomas Whitfield, Daryl Coley, The Clark Sisters and Ben Tankard, as well as his affinity for the artistry of the top Jazz players known as Oscar Peterson, Herbie Hancock, Art Tatum, and Chick Corea.

His love of music encouraged him to study at Humber College of the Performing Arts where he completed studies in the Art of Jazz in 1999. In the same year Courtenay formed *Perfect Cadence*, a Gospel Jazz Group which encompasses the traditional make up of Bass, Drums, and Keys.

Since then, Courtenay has moved into challenging yet inspiring territories of music that have allowed him to bring new light to Gospel Jazz, embracing the feel of Smooth Jazz, Fusion and other realms of music.







THE YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM AT OMVIC

The OMVIC (Ontario Motor Vehicle Industry Council) is Ontario's Vehicle Sales Regulator. OMVIC enforces the Motor Vehicle Dealers Act and other consumer protection statutes for the Ministry of Government and Consumer Services. OMVIC's mandate and role is to maintain a fair and informed marketplace by protecting the rights of consumers, enhancing industry professionalism and ensuring fair, honest and open competition for registered motor vehicle dealers. This is achieved by maintaining strict dealer/salesperson registration requirements; inspecting all Ontario dealers (new and used); providing free complaint handling to consumers; developing/delivering consumer and dealer education/awareness programs, and investigating and prosecuting industry non-compliance and illegal sales (curbsiding). OMVIC's partnership with the Youth Development Program began in early 2014 and has proven to be a highly rewarding experience.

OMVIC played a more active role in the Program this year. In August the YDP organized a weekend retreat for students which included numerous workshops. OMVIC presented a workshop on Resume and Covering Letter writing and Interview Preparation – a topic whose importance is not always appreciated or understood. We are pleased to report that the students were motivated, engaged and came prepared with important questions.

This year's summer placement student was Percival Scott who joined OMVIC's Registration team in early May. Percy has successfully completed his first year at York University working towards a Bachelor of Arts in Kinesiology and it did not take him long to fit in with the Registration team. Percy was respectful, eager to learn, professional and always brought a positive attitude to work. While all the placements we have had have been successful, Percy was able to further strengthen the relationship between OMVIC employees and the Youth Development Program.

The Youth Development Program has demonstrated itself as a valuable and worthwhile initiative for the young people in the Malvern neighbourhood and for OMVIC, and we look forward to continuing this important partnership.
