

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

# JONATHAN HOOD


KEYNOTE SPEAKER

# Jonathan Hood is a former CFL athlete, motivational speaker, youth mentor, corporate coach and business owner.


At the early age of 23, Jonathan began his professional football career after being drafted to the Edmonton Eskimos. Later, he went on to play for the Hamilton Tiger-Cats in 2010, and finally the Toronto Argonauts in 2013. What started off as a love for the game quickly turned into a passion for speaking when he and his teammates began making appearances at public school engagements.

A natural born leader, Jonathan quickly realized his ability to influence. In 2011, he founded <u>Ahead of the Game</u>, a <u>youth mentorship program</u> designed to empower youth and promote positive change. Since then, he and his team of facilitators have appeared at over 25 schools across the Greater Toronto Area and serviced over 1000 kids, youth, and young adults. Ahead of the Game quickly garnered a high success rate, with 91% of regular attendees not only passing classes, but attending sessions more regularly, actively engaging in participation, and having less negative interactions in the classroom, as well.

Now, Jonathan uses his gifts to inspire both youth and corporate professionals alike to reach their highest potential and #GetAfterIt. He can also be found speaking at corporate events, conferences, business fundraisers, educational facilities and much more.



Jonathan has been mentored under the leadership of business professionals such as John Maxwell and CFL Hall-of-Famer Michael 'Pinball' Clemons. He graduated from St. Francis Xavier University with a Bachelor of Arts (Honours) degree in Psychology. He also holds a Master's degree from The University of Western Ontario in Kinesiology/Sports Psychology.

Courtenay Frazer is a pianist with a wealth of stylistic knowledge.


He has been singing and playing instruments in the church since 1986, winning district and regional Teen Talent competitions for group ensembles, as well as piano solos at the church he attended - Driftwood Church of God. Courtenay went on to play keyboards for a country folk band, The Haltons, directed by his late father, Wosley Frazer. His journey soon took him into other arenas of music, where he began singing for the Gospel quartet "Surrender", a well-known group on the Toronto Gospel music scene.

Courtenay's diverse musical inspiration can be attributed to his deep appreciation for the music of such Gospel greats as Thomas Whitfield, Daryl Coley, The Clark Sisters and Ben Tankard, as well as his affinity for the artistry of the top Jazz players known as Oscar Peterson, Herbie Hancock, Art Tatum, and Chick Corea. His love of music encouraged him to study at Humber College of the Performing Arts where he completed studies in the Art of Jazz in 1999. In the same year Courtenay formed *Perfect Cadence*, a Gospel Jazz Group which encompasses the traditional make up of Bass, Drums, and Keys.

Since then, Courtenay has moved into challenging yet inspiring territories of music that have allowed him to bring new light to Gospel Jazz, embracing the feel of Smooth Jazz, Fusion and other realms of music.

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# THE EDGE PROGRAM AT OMVIC

The OMVIC (Ontario Motor Vehicle Industry Council) is Ontario's Vehicle Sales Regulator. OMVIC enforces the Motor Vehicle Dealers Act and other consumer protection statutes for the Ministry of Government and Consumer Services. OMVIC's mandate and role is to maintain a fair and informed marketplace by protecting the rights of consumers, enhancing industry professionalism and ensuring fair, honest and open competition for registered motor vehicle dealers. This is achieved by maintaining strict dealer/salesperson registration requirements; inspecting all Ontario dealers (new and used); providing free complaint handling to consumers; developing/delivering consumer and dealer education/awareness programs, and investigating and prosecuting industry non-compliance and illegal sales (curbsiding). OMVIC's partnership with The EDGE Program began in early 2014 and has proven to be a highly rewarding experience.

In June The EDGE Program organized a retreat for students which included numerous workshops. OMVIC presented a workshop on Office Etiquette – a topic whose importance is not always appreciated or understood. We are pleased to report that the students were motivated, engaged and came prepared with important questions.

This year's summer placement student is Dominque Hunte who joined OMVIC's Registration team in early July. In the fall, Dominque will be attending University of Ottawa's Biomedical Science Program in the extended French stream. Dominique is respectful, eager to learn, professional and always brings a positive attitude to work. All the placements have been extremely successful, and we look forward to further strengthening the relationship between OMVIC employees and The EDGE Program.

The EDGE Program has demonstrated itself as a valuable and worthwhile initiative for the young people in the GTA area and for OMVIC, and we look forward to continuing this important partnership.
